The award categories this evening demonstrate the breadth of digital talent and innovation we have here in the Territory.


The Awards Committee are to be commended on the calibre of the judging with a wealth of local, national and international industry and government experience represented.

Most recently, Stephen represented the interests of the ICT industry for the private and public sectors as a committee member for the ICT Industry Association NT.


Paul Macmillan


NEC STEM Student of the Year
